What is it??

Program began in 2011 in Asheville, NC

 Their goal was to engage as many people as possible in reversing the population declines of native bees, honey bees and other pollinators

- Second city (Talent OR) came on board in 2014
- Currently 104 cities, 28 states & DC

- Sharing & collaboration with other entities
- Shows our commitment to nationwide effort

- Access to Xerces database of info and latest research
- Press releases templates, brochure templates, T-shirt designs, signage, etc.

Benefits to being a Bee CITY USA

- Improve local food production through increased pollination
- Improve demand at local sources for native, pollinator friendly plants
- Assist in removal of invasive species
- Introduce an integrated pest management program, provide locals alternative possibilities for pest management
- Heighten awareness of seasonal changes

Requirements the City must meet

- ✓ Pass a Resolution designating us as a Bee City USA.
- ✓ Designate a city office to be the sponsor of the program
- Establish a committee to facilitate the program
- ✓ Host at least 1 educational event or pollinator habitat planting or restoration each year
- Install & maintain at least 1 Bee City USA sign
- ✓ Create & maintain a page on our website with info including progress of committee
- ✓ Develop & implement plan to create & expand habitat on public & private lands
- Identify & inventory real property that can be enhanced
- ✓ Create a recommended locally native plant list
- Create a list of local native plant suppliers
- Annually track acreage of pollinator habitat created or enhanced

Requirements the City must meet

- Create & adopt an integrated pest management
- Expand use of non-chemical pest management methods
- Each February after one full year in the program, apply for renewal and include a report on the previous year's activities
- ✓ Pay renewal fee based on population
- All requirements must be met within 2 years and continue maintaining and updating as needed after that time

What Have We Accomplished??

- Resolution passed by City Council
- Committee Formed June 3rd, 2019
- City Clerk's Office designated as Liaison
- Website established
- Public Awareness established as the number one priority


What Have We Accomplished??


